

Creative children's competition

Draw, paint or photograph a city dragon and you could win vouchers for CDs, DVDs or books

As part of the Norwich Dragon Festival, the Royal Society of St George (Trafalgar Branch) invites you to track down an image of a dragon, or one of St George, somewhere in Norwich and draw, paint or photograph it.

See what you can find but, to give you a few clues, look in the Castle Museum, and the churches of St George Tombland, St George Colegate, and St Gregory – and don't forget the Ethelbert Gate, Dragon Hall, and the roof bosses in the Cathedral cloisters! A panel of judges will be led by renowned local-based artist Colin Self. Prizes will be awarded in the following age groups – a £20 voucher for the winner and a £10 voucher for the runner-up in each age group:

- Under 7 years
- 7 – 11 years
- 12 – 16 years

To enter:

1. Draw, paint or photograph an image, carving or sculpture of a dragon or St George that you find in Norwich
2. On the back of your entry write:
 - your name, age, address and telephone number
 - include where you found the dragon or St George
 - if you are under 12 please include a title of your entry or a caption; if you enter in the 12 – 16 year old category include 50-100 words on why St George played such an important role in the history of Norwich
3. Put your entry in an envelope marked "Royal Society of St George Dragon Festival Competition".
4. Send your entry to: Norwich HEART, The Guildhall, Gaol Hill, Norwich NR2 1JS or drop it in to Dragon Hall, Norwich Castle or St George's Church Tombland

All entries must be received by 28th February 2009. Winners will be notified by 15th March 2009 and winning entries may go on display and be publicised in the local media.

So get out and about around the city with your paints, pencils and cameras – and happy hunting!

2. All entries must be received by 28th February 2009.
3. Entries can be posted to HEART (Royal Society of St George Dragon Festival Competition, Norwich HEART, The Guildhall, P.O. Box 3130, Norwich NR2 1XR), or dropped off in person at Dragon Hall, Norwich Castle or St George's Church Tombland.
4. No entries can be returned.
5. The competition is open to people aged between the ages of 0 and 16 years of age.
6. All winners may be asked for proof of their age.
7. The competition is not open to the Organisers (the Royal Society of St George and Norwich HEART), or their family members or anyone else connected to the competition.
8. Entry into the competition is acceptance of these Terms and Conditions.
9. Entries on behalf of another person will not be accepted and joint submissions are not allowed.
10. No responsibility is taken for entries that are lost, delayed, misdirected or incomplete or cannot be delivered or entered for any technical or other reason. Proof of delivery of the Entry is not proof of receipt.
11. By submitting an Entry, you (1) grant Norwich Heritage Economic and Regeneration Trust (HEART) the right free of charge to feature the Entry in HEART and its members' marketing material; (2) warrant to HEART that the Entry is your original work, and does not offend or invade the privacy of any person or otherwise infringe or violate any statutory, common law, regulatory or intellectual property rights of any third party.
12. One entry per person. HEART reserves the right to display and reproduce all entries.
13. The winner will be chosen by a panel of judges, including Colin Self.
14. There are three different age categories and each category will have one winner and one runner-up prize.
15. The prizes are non-exchangeable, non-transferable, and are not redeemable for cash or other prizes. The Organisers accept no responsibility for any costs associated with the prize.
